COHEN ANCESTOR REPORT

Since the last newsletter, I have not been very successful in my research.

I have not had a response from the Toronto Jewish Genealogy Society in regard to our relatives in Canada. The letter sent to Toronto was never returned so there is still a chance of a reply.

No response yet on the family of Isaac Cohen.

On my trips to the Family History Center, I have gone back and looked at more of the Censuses, passenger lists, etc. Did not find any additional information at this time.

If you have even the slightest tidbit that might help in my research, please, send it to me so that I can work on it further. Every little bit helps.

KLIMIST ANCESTOR REPORT

On one of my trips to the Family History Center, as I was looking through cabinets and cabinets of microfiche, I came across a film with Houghton Co., Michigan Vital Records, 1886-1894. It is through various letters of my grandparents, where the possibility that my grandmother, Ruth (Klimist) Cohen was born. They had been unsuccessful in locating a birth certificate for her. It was unknown what year she was exactly born, but it was approximately December 20, 1894-1899. I looked very closely at each page of records, starting with 1893. I was very fortunate at the end of film to find an entry for Rebekah Kloimistz. It showed Entry #1083; December 20, 1894; Birthplace-Calumet, MI; Father-Abraham Kloimistz; Mother-Lizzie Kloimistz; Occupation of Father-Storekeeper; Date of Record-June 11, 1895. I was very excited about finding this, as for many years my grandparents were unsuccessful.

I posted this information on the Computer Service, GEnie, and asked if there would be a birth certificate based on this information. I was told that the probability was very small as this would be the official record.

Mildred Klimist has supplied me with leads of possible ships that some of the Klimist family may have come over on to America. I have not yet been successful in locating them. As always, I will continue with these leads.

Other research of items have been unsuccessful. As in the COHEN research section, if anyone has even the slightest tidbit that might help in the research, please send it to me so that I can I work on it, further. Every little bit helps.

As of this writing, I have plans of meeting a descendant of Charley Klimist in the San Diego area at the end of July. I am excited about meeting someone from another branch of Michael Klimist's family.

The request for locating the census sheet with Charley and Lena Klimist has been unsuccessful on GEnie, the Computer Service. Another user checked the film, and found the same information that I did. It appears this is how the master film is.

OTHER TIDBITS

I have acquired the book Where Once We Walked, published by Avotaynu, a Jewish Genealogy Society of which I am a member. It is an extensive listing of all shtetls in the Eastern European area. Many of the shtetls no longer exist. In reviewing of the book. I have learned why many of the data that I find, ie: certificates, censuses, etc. refer to Russia. Before World War I, there was not a country called Poland. It was all considered Russia.

I have received the Translation Guide to 19th Century Polish-Language Civil Registration Documents. It is a very complex book. I will be looking for microfiche that cover where the families came from to see if there are any records.

My next area to concentrate on is the Naturalization Papers. Again, if anyone has in their possession any of these documents of their ancestors, I would appreciate a copy of them. I can obtain the Declaration of Intent passed on information that is located on the certificate.

Latest descendant count stands at 580 direct descendants of Shimmen & Shifra Silverstein; with spouses, 892. Newsletter circulation is 233 worldwide.

RESEARCH UPDATE

Received the certificate on Bunin SILVERSTEIN. His Anglicized name was Bernard. Bunin was born abt. 1862 in Russia, died December 14, 1933 in Los Angeles, CA. Married to Sarah Malke GOLDBERG. Occupation listed as a tailor.

Acquired the book Where Once We Walked, published by Avotaynu, a Jewish Genealogy Society that I am a member. It is an extensive listing of all shtetls in the Eastern European area. Many of the shtetls no longer exist. In reviewing of the book, I have learned why many of the data that I receive, ie, certificates, censuses, etc. refer to Russia. Before World War I, there was not a country called Poland. The cities of Tiktin and Bialystok were really in Russia.

I received the Translation Guide to 19th Century Polish-Language Civil Registration Documents. It is a very complex book. On my last venture to the Family History Center I made a copy from the microfiche of Bialystok and Tiktin, Poland Jewish Vital Records. They are written in script Polish, some very hard to read. So far on the one I am learning to translate from, is a death record from 1860. Will keep you posted if I am successful in finding someone from our family.

I have not been successful in locating the records of the ship New Amsterdam. This is the ship that Rasie (Silverstein) Goodman came over on. I received this information at the reunion from Rasie's granddaughter, Audrey Yohanna. I will keep looking for the ship.

The founder of the Lomza-Suwalki Interest Group that I wrote about in the last issue, is going to do an article in the future about Tiktin and Bialystok.

I haven't been too successful otherwise with my research at the Family History Center. If you have even the slightest tidbit that might help in the research, please send it to me so that I can work on it further. Every little bit helps.

I am starting my extensive research in the Chicago area telephone books to see if I can locate any of the missing descendants. With luck, I maybe able to make some connections.

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


